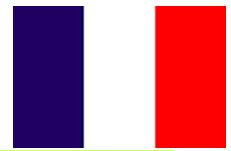

About the place

Marseille is the second largest city in France and is located on the Mediterranean Sea. Founded in 600 BC by the ancient Greeks as a strategic trading port, it was later conquered by the Romans and was a key hub for the French empire. This history has left a legacy which is evidenced by the city's beautiful architecture.

The 21st century has seen an influx of immigrants from first Russia, Italy, Spain and then North Africa. This has contributed to the city having a distinct feel to the rest of France and such cultural influences have helped to shape the city as a modern metropolis, with industries based around culture and arts. This has alleviated the unemployment suffered by the decline of the port industries during the 1970s.
