This project takes place in various locations throughout the UK, including England, Scotland and Wales. Volunteers will have the chance to work in various cities and seaside towns, possibly Manchester, Liverpool, London, Isle of Wight, Glasgow & Edinburgh. The volunteers will work alongside staff & long-term volunteers supporting the young people joining us from Spain. The camps offer young people from other countries (mainly Spain) 10 days sports, language and culture camps. We run approximately 10 camps every Summer & volunteers may work on one or two different camps. A volunteer will be able to take part in all arts, cultural visits & outdoor activities. Volunteers will be responsible for helping arrange activities and supervising the young people ensuring their safety & enjoyment. We will host a number of volunteers on each camp, ensuring that there is a good cultural exchange and the activities are fun.

Accommodation & Meals

Meals: The meals will be provided as part of the Summercamp activities, this will often be in a restaurant or café in the camp or in a city restaurant during visits. You will eat with the staff & camp participants. On cultural visit days volunteers will often take a packed lunch. Extra money will be given so volunteers can take their own meals during the days off.

Lodging: The accommodation will be in a shared room with one or more other volunteer(s) and staff in a chalet / tent or youth hostel. During their free days a volunteer may stay in one of our volunteer houses or may remain in the camp accommodation.

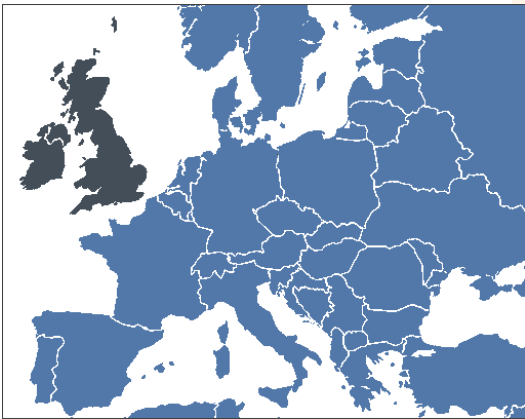
