Inclusion Through Sport

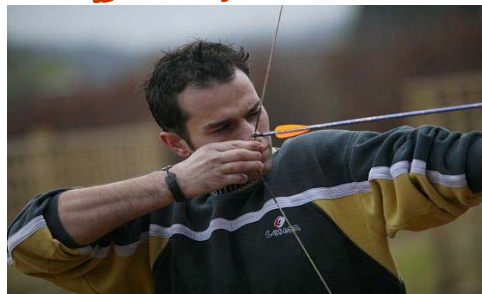
Volunteers will have the opportunity to work in local projects promoting youth sport with disadvantaged young people.

The activities involve sports and health and your role may include helping staff prepare activities in Sports & Youth Exchanges across the UK & Europe, as well as support in clubs & community organisations.

There is the chance to work in Herd Farm, a local outdoor activity centre, promoting activities for local groups who come & stay at this residential centre.

Another activity runs in a school and after school sports club with children between 5 and 11 years.

You will have the chance to work in different sporting fields, but should be flexible when it comes to modern & traditional sports as well as less known sports. You may also have the possibility to introduce sports typical from your country to groups you will work with.



Accommodation & Meals

Volunteers receive pocket money to buy food. Initially this is weekly in cash until we help you open a UK bank account. The accommodation you will live in has a kitchen and all utensils and equipment needed to prepare meals and also a washing machine, television & stereo (that may be shared between two flats). Volunteers will share a flat or house with other volunteers in Leeds or Bradford. You may need to use a bicycle to get between the accommodation and the project, we can provide you with this.

The accommodation is non-smoking and not all flats have a shower, some only have a bath. Long-term volunteers normally have their own bedroom but may have to be share with another volunteer for a short period.

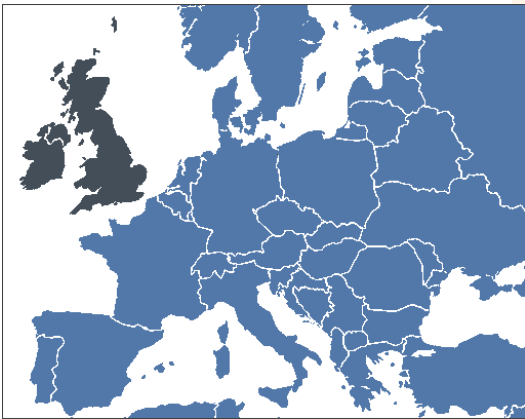
